PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Lynch, to close on your amendment. Senator Lynch waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Lynch amendment to AM2124 to LB 654A. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Lynch's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is adopted.
