SENATOR COORDSEN: (Laugh)

SENATOR TYSON: ...and between...no, between General and Select all interested parties, because the Game Commission is also an interested party here, sit down and see if we cannot work out some compromise in that interim?

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Tyson,...

SENATOR TYSON: Yes, sir, you were born in...

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...first of all...

SENATOR TYSON: ...Fillmore County, but not yesterday.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...Senator Beutler spoke at great length about compromise. Now I do not know whether the landowners nor the Nebraska Cattlemen or any other people who were involved in the negotiations that resulted in the writing of LB 701 or whether there were parties who were more parochial in their view. I would think, Senator Tyson, having been around here for a day or two, that the better process, and I appreciate your making the request, but the better process would be to adopt this amendment at this time. Then, between here and Select File, that the Cattlemen and the other representatives of the affected parties who are not, I think, other than Senator Jones and Dierks, here on the floor, decide what Select File amendment might improve the bill as it exists. But I do appreciate your offer, Senator Tyson. I think the process would be the better if we continue down the line that we're continuing, bearing...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: We're on your time, Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Pardon?
