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is implied in directly stating in the language. So I think I can support the bill as it is. I am interested in the debate but taking out the words "or indirectly" does help it in my mind and, with that, I will support the amendment and the bill at this point, although I am listening to the debate carefully. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. I would speak very, very briefly. Taking twelve notes out of a long song doesn't make it a good song. This is still an attack on management prerogatives. It still limits the ability of supervisors, managers to do their job in a manner in which they deem fit or necessary. If it's not a good practice, they won't do it. They have other things to do. This thing goes directly to micromanagement, and it's on that basis and that basis alone that I urge everyone to defeat (a) the Chambers amendment, and (b) this bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Further debate, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Tyson makes less sense the more he talks. Certainly a man as old as he is, usually I only refer to my age, but nobody could have started out at infancy and arrived at a level of misunderstanding that Senator Tyson has arrived at in anything fewer than 150 years. Did you listen to what "Baron" Tyson said, when it comes to management, if what is being done is not good, then the manager is not going to do it. Have you ever heard such a naive thing in your life? There are rules and regulations because managers and others do not do as they should and recourse must be provided. Let me make a statement about law enforcement, and it applies to other areas too. There is such a thing as prioritization. When there are many tasks to be undertaken, they do not all have equal importance or significance, so you give the greatest priority to those tasks which are most important or most significant. The statement, using a sledgehammer to kill a gnat, would describe Senator Tyson, I mean what he just said, or something like that. He
