SENATOR ENGEL: Well, do we have any time left?

SENATOR ENGEL: About...what we're basically talking about, as you know, and we're not going to discuss another bill, we're on one bill here, but we did get an Attorney General's Opinion on whether...and this particular using the cameras, whether that would be...pass the constitutional muster. And, of course, his opinion came back it would because there is no penalty and no points, and that's what I'm getting at.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: May I respond, if there's enough time?

SENATOR ENGEL: You, yes, I'd like...
