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you very much. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Wehrbein, followed by Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein, on the committee amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President, members of the body, I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question, if I may.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I missed a little of what you said earlier, I think, but the practical effect is what I'm after. What's the practical effect of us passing this bill compared to where we're at today, if you were a typical county attorney?

SENATOR BROMM: I think it has no effect at all, Senator Wehrbein, other than to place the statute in compliance with what the Supreme Court has said the law is. Otherwise, as far as practice, what a county attorney has to do or prove, or procedurally what he has to do, or she has to do, changes nothing.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, thank you. Senator Chambers, would...did you hear my question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: A typical county attorney would not have any change in his practice at this point, if this passes?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh no, this just brings the statutory definition in line with what the Supreme Court ruled.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, that's the way I understand it. I just wanted to be sure. Thank you.
