probably before they acquire it. But are you telling us that this is going to be outside of that scope?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, I'm not sure at this point. I acknowledge I don't know that this has gone through the process of notifying 309, and it should be. This is the first stage. We're going to have a hearing on the bill coming up yet...or we've had the hearing on the bill. But...and...but the point, at this point I don't see immediately 309 Funds. There's going to be General Funds and mostly Cash Funds. Into the future, it may well be appropriate to have a request for 309 Funds way down the road on this building. But I acknowledge that it should be...have the 309 Committee be aware of this.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, I appreciate your response. I guess the only reason I brought it up is because, over the years, we've gotten ourselves in a position where we accept property and didn't realize what it was going to cost to upgrade it, to get it where it was usable. And so what we're asking and what we sort of set a policy that, before any property that has maintenance upkeep on it, that the 309 is aware of it, and our people go out and examine the property. Our people go out and examine the property and get some idea as to whether there is going to be some costs, so they can at least put it into their planning project. And I think that that was the idea of setting up this new rule that we adopted a few years ago to get a...some kind of feel of what might be upcoming. And I just thought that I would suggest that...that, if we're going to accept this, that at least the 309 be advised and given an opportunity to take a look at the property. Would you have any objection to that?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, no, I would not.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Given that, I will turn the rest of my time back to the Chair, because Senator Wehrbein has answered that he would not have a problem in taking a look at having 309 Task Force take a look at this property before we in fact move ahead in acquiring it. With that, thank you, Mr. Chairman.
