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SENATOR SCHROCK: Sure.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...encourage that kind of study, so that it's more logical for everybody.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Just some further...there's a two million...if I may add, there's a \$2 million study going on, on the Platte River Basin now, about the hydrological study between the underground water and the river. And, of course, most of these wells on the islands, they are built on ground that is...sediment that has been deposited by the river. So the type of soil varies greatly, but there is certainly a lot of sand and gravel in it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. Senator Schrock, a few questions, please. Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schrock, would you respond?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Janssen, would you repeat the question.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Schrock, when you were talking about most of these wells are running center pivots, is that right, that they're pumping within 50 feet of a river bank?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, and so center pivot, unless you windshield wipe, it wouldn't lend itself to being located within 50 foot of a bank.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, but in fact can't they pipe that water a distance so that a center pivot could be operated from that particular well?
