SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...back into the ground, or back into that flow of the river. So thank you very much for answering these questions. Those are the answers that I suspected I would hear and appreciative for that.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, the problem with this amendment comes from the fact that the people drilling the wells and the farmers who are installing the wells did not think they were violating the law because they were further than 50 foot away from the bank. That leads me to believe that there may not have been any wells drilled within 50 foot of the bank. I could be wrong there, but we will check that out. But the thing that we're really concerned about here is that a lot of wells, not a lot of wells, but there were wells drilled and we're probably not talking great numbers that were on islands, certainly, probably 800 foot away from the banks, and they thought they were...they thought they were not in violation of the law. But as the law was interpreted by Department of Water Resources, they found out they were in violation, and therefore they were granted permits last year to pump, temporary permits. It's something that we need to correct, it's something that's been agreed to by the Department of Water Resources. So, Senator Janssen, I hope you had enough time. Do you need any more time?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, thank you, my questions have been answered, Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: All right, thank you. That concludes my remarks.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator. (Visitors introduced.) Further debate on the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Schrock, you're recognized to close. He waives closing. The question before the body is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 900. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.
