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the body, I do look at this as an expansion, however, of...of...of our...the gambling that we already have existing here. Any time that you can speed up that process, any time that you can feed dollars, coins into a machine quicker and thereby lose more quicker, I think is an expansion, and I rise to oppose that. I think that we have enough gambling in the state at the present time. As a matter of fact, a year ago we had the National Commission on Gambling, and the one thing that came out of that study was that there should be a moratorium put on any future gambling in the United States. I support that. I would...I will be voting against this bill and any other bill that comes before this body that would in essence take dollars out of our citizen's pockets any quicker. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Jensen. (Visitors introduced.) Further debate on AM0445 to LB 659? Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. I was not on the General Affairs Committee when this bill was heard. It did come out on a five to two vote in the committee. There were one, two, three, four, four proponents, and no opponents, and one in a neutral capacity there to testify. It was my pleasure this summer to go down and look at some of these machines upon Senator Lynch's request. I was amazed at the simplicity of the machines and the advantages that they had over the boxes of pickle tickets that are used right now. There is less storage, less handling and so on, because you do not have the paper tickets that you have to open by hand. Although, when operating a machine, I think Senator Lynch has alluded to this, you have to run your finger across that screen to expose if the ticket is a winner or a loser in the same manner that you have to open the ticket now that we have with the little pull-tabs on them. Each winner that you have, a receipt will come out of the machine. If I'm incorrect in explaining this, Senator Lynch, please correct me. But each ticket then is issued from the machine. And in order to redeem that certificate or that ticket, you must go to the cashier, if it's in a grocery store, or a liquor establishment, or wherever it might be, you have to present that winning ticket to the cashier and then redeem your prize. And you must most certainly
