be of age to redeem that ticket. So there's actually no...it's no different than if you pull that tab or that pull-tab off of the ticket, you have to, in the first place, you have to be old enough to redeem them. So someone under age playing them is actually no different than the way it is right now. The advantages I can see to a retailer or an operator that has these in his establishment is that there is probably a little less hassle in getting those tickets to the customer, although it all depends upon how many of these machines you would place in your establishment. I would imagine no one would want to put more than one or two in anyway. And we look at charitable gaming, which has been on the decline every since the boats and the dog track have come into...into Iowa. And I look at a lot of the American Legions, booster clubs and so on that have helped so many people with the proceeds from the pickle tickets. As far as an addiction to pickle tickets, I suppose they could be addictive, anything can be addictive.

And as Senator Lynch alluded to, it's been on the decline...
