SENATOR CHAMBERS: And...

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...lady volunteers, but they were not selected by the Governor as part of this group.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So he couldn't find, apparently, a qualified female in the First Congressional District, no qualified female in the Second Congressional District, and we know why they couldn't find a qualified female in the Third Congressional District because that has more miles than people, more cattle than people and other things that people from that area will state. Does this list of people constitute the total membership of this board, or are there others?

SENATOR HARTNETT: This constitutes the total membership.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is this the first time this board is being appointed?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yes, it is, Senator.
