PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is available for bills, not resolutions, so buckle-up and get ready because a train is rumbling through. And I've been spending a lot of time speaking out for white people on this floor, white women, basically, on this floor; and when the issues that pertain to us come up, I'm the only voice and I'm going to speak for me and mine the same way. Now back to this thing that's before us today. I shall vote no and I shall continue to vote no and I shall continue to raise these issues as long as the Governor or any other Governor continues in these practices that I think are inappropriate. Thank you, Mr. President.
