no longer needed and I will be introducing an amendment to LB 652 which basically guts it and puts the information from the other parts of the Judiciary Committee's recommendations into the bill. However, there have been negotiations going on, they were going on during the session last year, they went on over the interim and into this session, so the amendment that I'll be introducing, which I hope will become the bill that you will support, will have essentially two elements in it from last year's discussion. The first was a recommendation from the juvenile facilities master plan...no, excuse me, the Juvenile Detention and Juvenile Services Task Force that the Legislature created in 1998 that studied a variety of juvenile issues, and that recommendation was that the Office of Juvenile Services should assume placements at disposition of youth going into out-of-home placements. So that's half the amendment and we'll spend some time talking about that. The other half of the amendment was the...another bill that was introduced in last session by Senator Dwite Pedersen and it was amended into the committee amendments, which you'll...Senator Brashear will be discussing with you, which will be part of the amendment to the bill that I hope, with your approval, will become part of the bill. And what that does is transfer the facility that was approved by the 1994 Legislature to be created for juveniles in the adult serving...convicted as adults and juveniles who are serious chronic offenders in the juvenile system to...that was built in Omaha, that is open today, would transfer back to the juvenile system so that juveniles can access that facility. The blue piece of paper in front of you is what we will be discussing this morning. What you'll need to do is to know first that what's been printed on your buff sheet for the last few weeks about the facility master plan and the cigarette tax to fund it is no longer a part of the discussion. That's gone. What will be part of the discussion are the two elements on this blue sheet: first, the issue dealing with county costs and making the Office of Juvenile Services responsible for youth in out-of-home placements at disposition; and, second, to transfer the facility that is now under the Department of Corrections, that was transferred there on a floor amendment in 1997, back under the purview of the juvenile system. Under that amendment, the juvenile system, the Office of Juvenile Services, the Department of Health and Human Services can contract with the Department of Correctional Services to continue to run that
