Youth Center. We have mixed there the young people who are being charged as adults and those that are being charged in the juvenile court until they reach the age of 18. Once they reach the age of 18, they are transferred to the adult facility, the county jail, and held there until their disposition is made in the courts. After what Senator Chambers has said, and it's a passion with me that we separate youth, and I might add here it has not always been a passion of the Department of Correctional Services because they have never attempted to separate youth until that youth facility was given to them a year and a half ago. In fact, at this point, the depart...middle of December of last year, '99, we still had 10 kids under the age of 18 in adult population areas in the state Department of Correctional Services. Yes, some of them were in the Diagnostic and Evaluation Center, where they say they have to bring all people when they first come into the system, but I have seen them change their rules and regs up to 20 pages in one lump sum where they could have some time ago arranged to do D & E for those kids in the youth facility itself. Now I come to you with some expertise again, I might say, because this is not new to me. I've worked in this system for years. The map that, first of all, says main building is the Lincoln Correctional Center. It's a prison facility that is on the west side of Lincoln here and it is divided into units, and you will see down at the bottom there where it says housing unit C where I have done some circling. These units can be completely segregated from the other units, they are now, and each unit can be separated into fourths. That's where I made the little circles is where them units have doors to shut them off. Where you see the little arrows, that building was made for an addition, when it was originally built, was built to add on to, and there are knockouts in them walls where they could add on and not necessarily add on a whole lot of money. I'm talking about adding on an exit and, by looking at the other map where I drew in a circle, put in a yard for those people who they would keep in that particular units. We can separate the 18-year-olds, 19-year-olds and 21-year-olds if we want to. We could cater in the food. I had four senators go with me out to the prison a couple of weeks ago to see exactly this, and they agree with me that it could be done. The food is catered on carts now from that facility into the Diagnostic and Evaluation Center. We went by the gym, which was not late night, but nobody was using
