PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is the advancement of LB 654A to E & R for engrossing. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: LB 701, Senator, I have E & R amendments first of all. (AM7186, Legislative Journal page 593.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I move the adoption of E & R amendments to LB 701.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 701. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed nay. The amendments are agreed to.

CLERK: Senator Coordsen would move to amend. (AM2342, Legislative Journal page 606.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Coordsen, recognized for your amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Those of you that were interested in LB 701 may remember that we moved the bill from General File to Select File pending an amendment that would be offered at this time. I filed the amendment. Thanks to the good work of Senator Schrock, the Game and Parks Commission representatives, the representatives of Nebraska Cattlemen and Nebraska Farm Bureau and several other interested parties, including the bill's sponsors, met in Senator Schrock's office last Monday morning and reached an agreement on an amended version of LB 701. This is AM2342, but I can tell you probably in plain English more easily what this amendment does than your reading it. What this amendment does is provide that for state recreational trails, and there's only one of those in the state of Nebraska, the Game Commission has the same responsibility as the railroad and that...that...as a railroad trail, but that...that references only the posting for trespass and those requirements that provide for access between pieces of property where there is a division of the same landowner's property.
