PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Coordsen, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Only briefly, Mr. President. I appreciate those who have participated in the agreement and I only wanted to close in...to echo what Senator Schrock said. It's my belief, from all of the conversations that we had in the meeting, that Game and Parks will, in fact, work on special needs for any landowner that has demonstrated that. It does reduce the cost of fencing because the original bill or the amend...the original amended version of the bill did require a railroad type fence on...in places where there was...property was divided. This does not. This replaces the division fences with the same type of fences that the committee amendment had had for boundary fences, and I think will reduce the cost to Game and Parks for fencing of the trail. And they have also indicated to us that they will be posting signs at regular intervals so that the people who use the trails and enjoy our countryside do understand that that is private property on the other side of the trail. So I would...would encourage the adoption of this amendment and then the moving of LB 701 to Final Reading. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. The question is the adoption of AM2342 to LB 701. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Coordsen's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 701 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Question is the advancement of LB 701.
