I think this forces the issue. The state will have to respond and we need to accept our responsibility that right now, in those two counties, is going to property tax payers and I don't believe should be there. But I'm hopeful that the department will step up to the plate, that the Governor, if...when this bill passes, hopefully, will, as a budget is developed next year, look at those deficiencies, plan for the fact that there are more youth coming in. Now the second part of this bill takes back the facility in Omaha to the juvenile system for use by both the adult and the juvenile system, and the budget to do that. So there will be a number of placements there which are, what I believe, are similar to the placements that some of the judges are making because Kearney doesn't have a long enough length of stay and doesn't have treatment that we will have opened up some additional placements through this bill that won't force a fiscal note next year or a budget jump to the extent that people might be worried about.
