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done piecemeal if we're going to work together. In...well, let me turn on my light again because I can't finish it on this time to speak.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hilgert.

SENATOR HILGERT: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I am going to be drafting a couple of amendments that the body can choose from. I'd certainly be willing to work with the principal introducer of this bill or anyone else who has an interest in this bill. Concerning the part, the shortcoming that I see in the bill is that the discretion, frankly, is just too broad. Do you want to stop these people with these drunk driving records or not? Or do you just want to stop some of them, or do you just want to stop some of them from Iowa, or do you just want to stop some of them with Arizona or Texas plates? If this is a good bill and this is a good law and this is a good procedure and we need to stop these drunk drivers who are coming into the state, which we do, I agree with Senator Dierks, I agree with the Lincoln Journal on their editorial, which we do need to stop them, then this should apply to everyone who...who gets charged with this. This should not just be left up to the whim of a county attorney to determine whether we're going to do research on this individual or not. I mean, Senator Chambers, I said, frankly, that Senator Chambers was wrong. He said, well, some important person is going to get some high-priced attorney and declare this unconstitutional. Well, I tell you what, I mean, what are the chances of that type of person being...being...background being checked on? I don't know if this is ever going to come into play, but it is going to come into play in certain instances. And when we are talking about criminal law, it should apply equally, it should apply to everyone; everyone equally and the same. I went to and talked to the city of Omaha, who is lobbying this bill, and they agreed, everything should be fair, every...the enforcement should be fair. So the city of Omaha is on board with making this mandatory and uniform. I certainly am not going to do this on General. I'll do it on Select. I have two options. I am open to more, but I would like to have that issue addressed in some concrete way, whether we just make it mandatory for the bordering states of Nebraska, make it mandatory throughout the
