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United States and the territories; frankly, I don't think we've had too many drunk drivers arrive in Nebraska from Guam, so I'm not sure, frankly, why that's even in there. But anyway, or maybe they are thinking of Puerto Rico, who knows. But anyway, that is an issue that I would like to see addressed, and I plan on introducing some amendments on Select File regarding that...that part of the bill, which I think there's a big hole in, there's a big hole in it. How embarrassing would it be for a county attorney not to do the research on an individual, and then it would come out later that this person had numerous prior convictions? I don't think anyone wants to see that happen. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hilgert. Senator Engel, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR ENGEL: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, in answer to Senator Hilgert, as far as making it mandatory, I think the county attorneys, at this point in time in my area, are really...they've got plenty to do. So...but the only thing with the incentive of being able to enhance the penalty, I'm sure they will do it, but in...the first place they'd probably check is with the last state these people came from and the bordering states. And what, pursuing beyond that, I don't know whether that's the answer. We're not going to discuss it now. We'll discuss it between now and Select File. So, and as far as when we checked the statutes in the different states, where this came from as far as using the Puerto Rico and different...who belong, actually belong to the United States, is...that came out of the Colorado statute, and that's the one we used, basically, to...for this language, because it was...we felt it was a little tighter and left a little room for interpretation, which we find out there is still a little interpretation in the bill. So, and with that, I will yield the rest of my time to Senator Chambers, because he had some more comments he wanted to make.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you've got about four minutes on Senator Engel's time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Engel, and the reason I decided to speak on the committee amendment, if I needed additional time, then I could use some of it on the committee
