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amendment. Then when the bill, itself, is to be advanced, and I am not going to hinder the advancement of it either, but a difficulty that I see, and it's unclear to me what is referred to, when we get to the committee amendment, the part that's left, it would be page 1 of the committee amendment, and starting in line 14, "if the offending act was committed in this state, would be a violation of this section, as such section existed at the time of such conviction regardless of subsequent amendments to such section." I don't know if the "such section" is referring to the section being amended by the committee amendment, or "such section" in the law of another state, which may have been amended? So there are things that need to be clarified and I think the bill is unduly vague and it's why sometimes it's not good to just lift what is written in another state, because you don't have people in their Legislature as careful as I am. And what we need to do, I think, is make sure that, whatever we say, it's clear in terms of what we mean. If we use the phraseology "such section", we should not, within that paragraph, be talking about more than one section, because you will not know which section that language is referring to. So if there are two ideas that are similar, there is nothing to prevent us from subdividing them and dealing with one aspect under a small (a) and the next one under a small (b) or a small Roman numeral. But when an attempt is made to put too many things together, it becomes unclear what is being referred to by language that modifies or refers back to something that had gone before. So those are not any of the things I will try to amend now, but when we get to Select File, I hope to have had some discussions and have had a chance to do a little more research myself so that we will not take forever on the bill. But I hope the body would indulge us, and if it does require extensive discussion to be sure that we've got the kind of bill we want, this is one of those subject areas where I think full debate is warranted. And I would hope that anybody who has any question would ask it so we can make a...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
