SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time. Senator Chambers, you can continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Continuing with this comment at the bottom of the page which I wrote, in my scrawl, "Females"...no, "Baron" Tyson, that is not a misspelling of tamales. "Females, including my legislative colleagues, should be grateful that I continually raise my voice against the denigration of women, even though they remain virtually mute." Part of the difficulty faced by women in this society is the conditioning that takes place from the time they are little, bitty girls, right on up through adolescence, young womanhood, mature womanhood, and it continues. I've frequently mentioned that charade, called the Ak-Sar-Ben Coronation, where they always pair some old, doddering geezer with some other old doddering geezer's young daughter. But they have never thought to make the old geezer, who is to be the king, have his wife be the queen. One thing that can be said about William of Orange, when he came to rule England, at England's invitation, he did bring his wife, Mary. So it was William and Mary, not William and Cinderella, not William and Barbie, but William and Mary. So these things happen constantly throughout society, and I have set my mind to it, but I don't know of a single other public official in this state who deals with this issue as I deal with it on anything like a regular basis. Yet we see what it is doing to our young women, we see the lack of self-respect, the lack of self-esteem, the self-doubt, the feeling that certain subject matters are beyond their ability to grasp and understand.
