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can correct every problem that comes up from a health standpoint. Can a significant number of them be improved so that they...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BYARS: ...do not approach the stigma, the problems,...okay, I'll yield.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Wehrbein, and those wishing to follow, to speak are Senators Beutler, Byars and Redfield. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members, I suppose if I was in a committee, I'd be neutral. I just wanted to call the body's attention to this. And I'm going to call...I'll probably use the word a lot, I'm trying to think of something new every session. This is probably called budget creep. And I just wanted to call the body's attention to the cost of this. If I remember right, and Senator Byars may correct me, about 250, \$150,000 a year this will add. Is that accurate, Senator Byars? May I ask that question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Do you yield, Senator Byars?

SENATOR BYARS: Yes, I do. The initial fiscal is just right at \$202,000, Senator. I think that's strong, particularly in the first year. We aren't, as we gradually move into this, going to have that many Medicaid babies that are tested through the first year or two years, as we get into this. So I think it will be less. But \$202,000 is General Fund dollars.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: If I may use the word...may use \$200,000 a year anyway. So...and as I look down many of the budget...the bills that are coming, there are small amounts, which is relative in each one of us' mind about what those costs are. And so I just want to call the attention, and I'm not really saying that we can't do it. You can do anything you want, but the issue is going to be as we move on down the road, the next 30 to 45 days, is where is it going to come out of? There is not room for new spending particularly. And I was going to make the point Friday, before we left, and I...there is going to be
