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Trust Fund. And you and I are both...both feel that way. Senator Jensen introduced legislation which I cosponsored and which now we've had to change because we, quite frankly, the public outcry from the health sector was very significant to try to bring 50 percent of that to the Health Care and Excellence Trust Fund, the income from that trust fund back to this body to determine how we would spend it. I think we're still a work in progress. I would agree with you, I think there is going to have to be some changes from a grant process. I think there are health issues that definitely can be addressed through that trust fund on an ongoing type basis. At this point in time, however, I don't think...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BYARS: ...LB 950 would be one of those.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Those wishing to speak on the advancement of LB 950 are Senators Byars, Redfield, Brown, Raikes, and Beutler. Senator Byars, to speak on advancement.

SENATOR BYARS: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. This might alleviate Senator Redfield's light. I want to try to answer the questions and discuss the dialogue that we were having. The procedures that are used once bilateral hearing loss is identified, I tell you quite honestly I am not as familiar with as maybe I should be. And on Select File maybe I can get more answers, or in the meantime get that information for Senator Redfield. What I'm told by people in the hearing field and by pediatricians is that it is absolutely significant in identifying these children to prevent tremendous increased costs in the future for those children who are not identified, and then even more invasive procedures have to be taken to try to correct the problem. Many times when it's not identified in that first six months, to a year, to a year and a half, it becomes even much more significant. I'm not sure, hearing aides can be used on infants now, I know that that can happen and is done. I know that there are some surgical procedures that can be done also and fairly simple procedures that can change a child's life. I don't know how often they are used, Senator Redfield, I really don't, and I wish I could answer that
