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going to see the cost of this come down substantially. I was, in December, at the birth of number 14 grandson and in a few moments there after they bring the child out of the womb and into the nursery they do this series of tests, and there are five now that are mandated that are being done in every single hospital. This would become number six. All of those tests won't take really, put together, would not take, I don't think, much more than 15 minutes. And they do the...the hearing test itself takes, that is proposed, takes, oh, about five minutes is all. And I...so I think the cost is going to come down and every hospital will have this. This will be standard procedure in the future so I think that's a possibility. Going back again to the Excellence in Health Care Trust, I hope you'll be patient with myself and the committee as we work through this, and we will bring forward then next year, into the long session, a bill that you can review and decide if you also feel that this is a way to go in this large amount of dollars and I'm...I think we're very fortunate that we have this available. Also, there's no question about it, these dollars need to go in for public health. This is a public health issue. We can never forget also that these dollars are coming from, at least some of them, coming from the Tobacco Settlement Fund, so there needs to be dollars spent on smoking cessation and smoking related diseases, and I hope that we can do that too. I hope I've answered some of those questions. If not, turn your light back on. I'd be glad to respond further on the trust fund. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Beutler, you're recognized on the advancement of LB 950.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Jensen, I would invite some...some further discussion if you are game. The...two or three questions that are related that I would like to ask you in terms of what the committee is thinking. The advisory committee so far has been taken up with the grant process and getting that all established which, of course, is their first responsibility. Is it their responsibility to develop a vision beyond the grant program of how the money in the fund may be used? Or is there...is the given direction for them currently simply to facilitate a grant program and decide priorities as among the various categories within the grant program? So I'm interested, first of all, in who's responsibility it is to formulate that
