local dealers and give them the opportunity to make their living like we want the opportunity to make our living in production agriculture. So I will support the bill, the amendment as well, and urge the rest of the body to do the same. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Senator Beutler, on AM2348. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bromm, if I could inquire with respect to a particular distinction that I'm interested in and, while I'm explaining what the distinction is, if you could look at page 15, the new language, which was referenced by Senator Chambers. And I think this distinction may have something...I'm interested in the distinction as it relates to this particular provision and maybe others in the bill. As I hear your description of what this bill is all about, to some extent it's about manufacturers and distributors either owning or controlling too much franchises and franchisees, right? That's...that's the main thrust of the bill as I understand it, and let me go on and you can confirm or deny. The other thing that's happening here, and I think it's a precedent setting thing in terms of how we may deal with it. But you and I both know that the Internet is now the seller of a great many products, and I don't actually know right off the top of my head whether, when you buy a product on the Internet, for example, if I buy a car from a New Jersey dealer or directly from a manufacturer over the Internet, is that...is that transaction affected by this bill and by the language on page 15, and was it intended to be? In other words, if you buy a car in Council Bluffs at a physical location and it's delivered in Nebraska, apparently that's covered by the language on page 15 that you described.

SENATOR CROSBY PRESIDING

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BEUTLER: If I buy a car over the Internet from a place in New Jersey for delivery in Nebraska, is that covered by this bill? Well, first of all, is it intended to be covered by this bill; is it covered by this bill and; thirdly, should those things be covered by this bill? I'm trying to get at what I
