bond because to have a motor vehicle license you've got to have a bond and I, if memory serves me right, it's 25, 20-25 thousand dollars of a bond, but you also get our consumer fraud laws. You're going to get venue for a local court so that the dispute, if you have a dispute over a delivery or you never get the title, which is usually the problem, that occurs in your local court and you don't have to run into another state.
