SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...it adds on to, is how I read that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And remember we're talking about the relationship between this dealer and the purchaser, because all this dealer is doing is passing the vehicle through himself or herself on to the Nebraska purchaser.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I think...I think that's exactly right, but...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But all this other is in there so that the purchaser will not think that, by dealing with this person, this dealer, that I can go back to this dealer to have any repairs made that need to be. The dealer, once the car is passed through, is hands off.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Washes...washes their hands, unless that person wants to take the risk of, you know, they want them to do it, but that'd be a foolish thing to do.
