SENATOR CHAMBERS: But what the person can do, after the dealer has taken hands off, is make the dealer have to get that car repaired up to the requirements of the manufacturer's warranty.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Oh, now, okay, I don't read it that way. That...that's a legitimate difference in the way you'd read it. Maybe that needs some clarification, but I...I would not read it as...as that.

SENATOR CROSBY: Time. Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Madam Speaker and members, I have a couple questions and I guess maybe Senator Bromm is...I'd like to ask.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Bromm, will you yield for a question?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I've had a couple...

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...ask me and so I'm going to ask you so it's clear. If I was to buy a car in Kansas City or Phoenix, took delivery there and drove it home, this is not impacted by this bill, is that correct?

SENATOR BROMM: I'd say that's correct.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That, that may be going on commonly now, is not. This is mostly if you buy a car there and you would take delivery in Nebraska. That's...that's where the impact of this amendment is.

SENATOR BROMM: That's right, Senator.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. I...I'm going to talk about the bill as a whole when we get to it, rather than confine it to this
