SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, you have about a minute and a half.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, thank you. I've been out in the lobby on another matter and I've kind of lost the track here for a second, but I'll be back. Thank you.

SENATOR BROMM: Sure.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Kristensen, on the first part.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Members of the Legislature, I...Senator Beutler, are you, and I know you're busy so go ahead, you don't have to...just listen and part of this is record. One of the discussions that always occurred, particularly as we began to look at the explosion of Internet sales and so on, beyond tax collection, was what do the states do to protect themselves, and should they protect themselves and, if they decide they wanted to do it, how do they do it. There are a variety of bills around the country that would be very broad. In other words, would do similar things to...like this only to all products and say that deliveries must come in, or some of them treat them differently. And you found, yeah, interstate commerce says you can't inhibit the flow of commerce. But the reason I think this bill is different and the reason I think that we start off is we could have a broad-based bill that would require all products that are basically distributed type products from manufacturers and do this and have a broad paint brush. We would spend all of our time talking about the little things--mufflers, widgets or whatever you want to--and most of the discussion would be, well, the bigger things maybe it makes sense for but the problem with that bill would be all the little things. This bill starts on the bigger things. The average Nebraskan buys their home and that's their largest expenditure. Coming up second is the purchase of a motor vehicle in terms of the largest purchase or investment that a Nebraska family makes, and that...that risk of money is the reason that it's distinguishable in my mind, is that there's a substantial outlay of money to get this product. You need more protection as you spend more money. Obviously,
