AM2348, be adopted to LB 1018? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the first component of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Part one is adopted to LB 1018. Mr. Clerk, items for the record?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, thank you. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 204, LB 419, LB 438, LB 504, LB 510, LB 626, LB 654, LB 654A, LB 701 as correctly engrossed. Enrollment and Review also reports LB 652, LB 652A, LB 922, LB 1004 to Select File, some of which have Enrollment and Review amendments. And, Mr. President, Health and Human Services Committee reports LB 1144 to General File; LB 708, General File with amendments, LB 1023, LB 1141; and LB 963 indefinitely postponed. That's all that I had, Mr. President, thank you. (Legislative Journal pages 692-702.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We are now open for discussion on part two of the divided question, AM2348, part two, which include lines 5 through 9. Those wishing to speak? Senator Chambers. (FA290, Legislative Journal page 702.)
