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able to successfully operate his or her farm?

SENATOR JONES: No, I don't because I don't have one myself and I got about four or five hundred acres. I can't afford one because they're just too expensive for the...you've got to have so many acres to qualify to have one. That's all there is to it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So...

SENATOR JONES: If you don't have a thousand acres, you just as well forget it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Don't jump ahead of me because I'm learning. I'm an urban senator. Now, there are some farmers for whom a combine is essential. Would you agree?

SENATOR JONES: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's when you get these larger farms that you were talking about.

SENATOR JONES: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When you have one of these large farms, is there anything you can substitute for the combine and get the work done?

SENATOR JONES: No, there isn't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, for these farmers, it is absolutely essential to have a combine.

SENATOR JONES: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If that combine breaks down are you able, meaning the person who has one of these large farms, to go to an implement dealership and say, I want you to rent me a combine right now?

SENATOR JONES: That would only be the case if he's got one or two on the lot. I know...I know several neighbors that do rent
