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them, but they usually make them arrangements ahead of time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's what I mean. All right. Now, if you go into an auto rental place, can you rent a car? You've got the credit card and everything they need. Can you rent a car right now on the place from the auto car...auto dealer, I meant the rental place?

SENATOR JONES: Normally, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it's not as...it's not essential...it's not as essential to protect auto dealers, it seems to me, and those who repair automobiles as it would be to protect farm implement dealerships. What do you think, in terms of the effect on those who need those implements?

SENATOR JONES: The farm implement would be more important, but you've got to look at it another way too. If a dealer...if a, say, a manufacturer takes over a dealership, he might stock his place with the kind of cars that's selling the most in the area and leave the others that can't get ahold of that type of a car.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well...

SENATOR JONES: That's where we're having the problem.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, before we jump to the car, let's stick with the farm implements. I know some farm senators don't like to represent the interests of the farmers, but I'm going to hold your feet to the fire today. What is to prevent John Deere from shutting down a dealership and thereby depriving an entire area of the services of that dealership? What in Nebraska law would prevent that from happening?

SENATOR JONES: I don't know of any.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Nothing. Because I intervened trying to help a John Deere dealership, this was many years ago when I first came to the Legislature, and they sent representatives from Chicago to meet me at the airport to talk about it and try to persuade me not to be too angry. Why...
