SENATOR CHAMBERS: Very good. Members of the Legislature, I don't know how I will ultimately vote on this bill, but there are two levels of difficulty or two levels of discussion that I think are necessary. The first is to correct as much of the language as we can to get the bill to say what those who support it want it to say. Then, when all of that technical work has been done and suitable language has been provided, we can then discuss the philosophy behind the bill and determine whether we think this is a wise policy for the state to adopt. So, even though along the way I will take the opportunity to make some comments about the bill and the philosophy behind it, I'm going to try initially, when an amendment is before us, to restrict what I say to that amendment. I do agree with this language that the second part of Senator Bromm's amendment is going to provide us. On page 15, in line 23, he would strike the words "requires or allows" and insert "which does not take place in the state of Nebraska provides for". Reading that language by itself may seem incoherent, but what it is designed to say is that if a transaction for the selling and purchasing of a vehicle takes place outside the state but the car is to be delivered within Nebraska, then that delivery must be done through a Nebraska dealer. I have a question that I want to ask of Senator Bromm.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, do you yield?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, as I've stated, I'm in support of adding this language because it does make clear what is being intended. When we say the transaction does not take place in the state of Nebraska, does that refer to a sale that might occur via the Internet?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes, it could, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Under the Uniform Commercial Code, it's been a long, long time since I read that, will a sale of this kind take place at the domicile of the seller or the buyer? Where would this sale be deemed to have taken place, this transaction?
