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SENATOR BROMM: Senator Chambers, if the delivery occurs in Nebraska then I think that subjects the seller to the laws of Nebraska with respect to that product. That's my recollection. But if the delivery is FOB Massachusetts or something, I think there is no connection with our Uniform Commercial Code.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But I'm...I'm at the step before we get to delivery.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm at the point...

SENATOR BROMM: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...where a transaction is to take place. Senator Beutler is located in Massachusetts and I'm located in Nebraska...

SENATOR BROMM: Gotcha.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and we strike a deal and I find out about him through the Internet. Where is the locus of that transaction?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: I was jumping ahead a little bit and I apologize for that. I think it's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's all right.

SENATOR BROMM: ...I think it's where he's at in Massachusetts.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So wherever the seller is, is where we would say the transaction took place.

SENATOR BROMM: I...I believe so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I'll turn on my light again. I'm just trying, as we go along, to get some things clear.
