SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Your light is on next and this will be your third time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: On this second part of the amendment?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is the first...that was the first time I spoke on the second part of the amendment. Isn't it? See, we divided...oh, I've spoken twice already? Things sure move rapidly when you're having fun. (Laugh) I still only count one, but I'm not going to...I'm not going to stick on that point because there will be other opportunities to discuss it. But under this second part of the amendment we would be saying that, after it's added to the bill, when the delivery occurs it would be through a dealer who is licensed to be a dealer in Nebraska, and I'm trying to wait till Senator Bromm finishes his call. I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, do you yield to a question?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, to be a dealer the person need not be selling new cars. Is that true?

SENATOR BROMM: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The person does not have to actively be selling used cars or any other kind of car from a lot where cars are located. Is that true?

SENATOR BROMM: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, not only theoretically but under the law, a person who wants to sell cars in Nebraska could live in another state but procure a dealer's license in Nebraska. Is that true?

SENATOR BROMM: That is true.
