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SENATOR BROMM: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. I hope I'm not confusing things, but I'm trying to ask the questions that were in my mind yesterday and I wasn't sure of the answers. So, since that's my third time, I will not speak further on this amendment other than to say that I support the adoption of this part of Senator Bromm's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. We are discussing part two, the divided amendment, AM2348, to LB 1018. Senator Beutler, you're next to speak.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bromm, just another clarification, to continue on with some of the...some of the discussion. On page 19, 18 and 19 at subsection (5), deals with manufacturers and distributors and other persons who sell motor vehicles who have a license or are required to have a license to sell motor vehicles in this state, it says that they shall...they shall not, directly or indirectly, sell motor vehicles by mail or the Internet to any consumer in this state without first complying with this act and the motor vehicle registration...or the motor vehicle licensing sections. It goes on to say that advertising is not considered selling. And then it goes on to say that if they do advertise apparently and if they identify sources that are out of state, they then have to make further reasonable efforts to identify each and every franchisee of the manufacturer or distributor within the consumer's community. So this part then is not about vertical integration, not about cars delivered in this state, but is a further requirement related to cars that are actually sold entirely in another state. Would that be accurate?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: You lost me on the last part of that statement, Senator Beutler. I was with you up till then. Could you...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: ...repeat that for me?
