And so I would suggest that, if you're following along, you take the AM2426, take your green copy of the bill and write these words in and read it and see if it doesn't flow and make more sense to you than the way it was worded before. Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. We are now open for discussion on AM2426 to LB 1018. Senator Bromm, your light is next, did you wish to...your light was next or is next.

SENATOR BROMM: Well, I'll simply go on to say that my...my purpose or intent for this amendment is to improve the bill and to make the terminology more legally acceptable and to make it a stronger bill in terms of the terminology. I don't...I guess I don't want to repeat myself, so I don't think I have anything to say on the amendment, unless there are questions that other people wish to raise. Otherwise, I'll ask that the amendment be adopted.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Beutler on AM2426.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bromm, just an example, if I may. I think the amendment is a great improvement. Let me just...let me just state it in terms of an example and tell me what happens. If...if a person buys an automobile, the motor vehicle dealer takes responsibility for compliance with all applicable laws, is jointly and severally liable. If it turns out that the purchaser of the car needs to have a warranty guarantee taken care of, something goes wrong but it's under warranty, they need to have that taken care of, who...who is responsible for that? Who...yes, who is liable for it? Thank you.

SENATOR BROMM: The...the liability...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Was that a question?

SENATOR BROMM: The liability for making that repair would be on the seller as well as the dealer that the delivery took place through. So, this would give the buyer a person to look to, here in the state, if it was delivered in the state, and that
