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SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...will give you jurisdiction rather than just proclaiming it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Okay,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I'm not sure I...am I in the area that you're...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...yes, you're very clear to me what you said.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, if you have one of these transactions, you have diverse citizenship. You have citizen...so a person could, under federal law perhaps, get this dispute in the federal court, if the amount is sufficient.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yeah, if you have a case in controversy, right, jurisdictional amounts, that's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the seller could try to have it moved to a jurisdiction where the seller is located, in a federal court there, isn't that true?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yeah, they'd probably want to have it in state court, wherever they reside, but sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, the reason I'm asking these questions is so that it's clear, not everything necessarily be...will be decided in a state court in Nebraska,...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I think...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...even if we put this in it.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I think that's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you on this time around.
