buyer begin, let's speak of an Internet sale, provides for delivery in Nebraska, then I think the person that delivers that car here in Nebraska becomes an agent for the seller. And that gives the consumer in Nebraska a place to turn to make sure that that contract between the buyer and the seller is performed up to whatever the contract terms are. So I think that is another...I think this discussion has really helped focus us on what the primary purpose of this bill is. I also provide another piece of information just for the body. While these gentlemen were discussing the bill, I checked on the bond that was mentioned. And the bond for a dealer, whether it be used or new, is \$25,000. And I personally think that might be a point of discussion at some time. I don't...I think that that maybe deserves airing out and deserves a hearing and so forth. But I personally think that bond is inadequate for a lot of situations. And so I would just give the body that information. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Beutler, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bromm, if I could.
