SENATOR BROMM: Delivery could occur at...at different locations, I assume. So I suppose, I suppose the seller could try to make an arrangement to deliver the cars to...to a cooperating...through a cooperating dealer somewhere outside of that franchise holder's area, outside of that franchisee's...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...area.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers, on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, these are good questions. And even after the discussion when each of gives our best shot at it, I'm not sure that they have been definitively answered. I'm looking at the existing...the language that the bill would put into the law on page 12, where it talks about what a manufacturer or distributor cannot do if this language becomes the law. And it says that this manufacturer cannot own an interest in a franchise, franchisee, or consumer care or service facility. This is difficult. But let me touch on something before I get to that. Since a manufacturer can, in other states, have a franchise, sell its own vehicles to the public, that might be the situation where the manufacturer as a franchisee of itself, holding its own franchise in another state, would do some of this Internet selling. So we have a situation, and I'm going to go back to what I think Senator Beutler was mentioning, where a vehicle transaction takes place in Massachusetts. The car is a Honda and it's to be delivered in Nebraska. What I think Senator Beutler is asking, and his voice kind of trailed away at the end but I'm sitting right in front of him so I heard it, why would a Honda dealer in Nebraska agree to deliver Honda's that are sold in another state? Wouldn't that Honda dealer in Nebraska rather the purchaser purchase from him or her in Nebraska? So, no Honda dealer in Nebraska is going to be the one who will deliver a Honda that was sold in another state but to be delivered in
