Nebraska, because to do so is to take away a potential customer. So a Honda dealer in Nebraska is never going to deliver the Honda that was purchased in another state but is to be delivered in Nebraska. So the only one you can find who will deliver any one of these vehicles is going to be one who is not a franchisee of the manufacturer of that vehicle. So the only ones who will deliver Honda's are dealers who sell or deal in other cars. And that, brothers and sisters, is why you might wind up with "Patch-Eye John" as the one making these deliveries. It's not going to be a cooperative thing between franchisees of the same manufacturer, such as the Honda dealer in Council Bluffs dealing with a Honda dealer over here in Nebraska, because that...they're close enough together where they might kind of interact and work with each other because one is not killing off the other. But when you have a situation where the seller is totally away from here and is only going to be making purchase...sales, why would a dealer of that particular car consent to deliver a car of that kind to somebody in Nebraska for nothing? It's not going to happen. What I want somebody to explain to me now, and if Senator Kristensen is there, Senator Kristensen, I'd like to ask you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

Senator Kristensen, on page 12, when we talk about a manufacturer in line 20 not owning an interest in a franchisee, franchise or consumer care or service facility, what does the word "interest" mean? And you won't get a chance to answer it, because the time is up, but I got my light on again.
