SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: It would be a legal interest, some evidence of ownership.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You have 15 seconds yet.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll just wait until the next time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Kristensen, you're recognized to speak.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Senator Chambers, what I'll do is make my points and then I'll give back a little so you can do that. I think, and I'm calling back to...remembering some testimony we've had from years past, that it is not uncommon for a dealership here, let's use your Honda example, where if a Honda is purchased in Colorado or somewhere outside, that you wouldn't have a Nebraska Honda dealer deliver it. And the reason is that those Honda dealers, like the sticker that's on the back of your vehicle, it's got Honda on it, it's a...it's a...I mean, think about what other products are like that, where you have that constant advertising. That's the reason the car has a name and it's got a manufacturer's identification to it. Those local dealers like having other products running up and down the road. It's a constant advertising thing. And they also like to do the service work, because they can make some money doing service on it. When the warranty runs out you're not going to take your car to Colorado or Massachusetts for repair work. You're probably going to take it to your local Honda dealer so they can...they...they...I think the current practice is they usually do make those deliveries because their...it's on the come, they're going to get it later. And so they like that, plus they like having Honda's on the road. And if they see somebody prestigious driving the Honda, you know, it wears off a little bit. Might work the other way, too. But in terms of ownership, I want to go back to that, the ownership of an interest I think would be implied to be a legal ownership interest and not just a fanciful if they do well I have an interest in it. I think you're talking about evidence of legal ownership. I'd allow Senator Chambers to respond.
