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offering an amendment. For example, I might offer an amendment to strike the words "representative and affiliated", and that would give us an opportunity to discuss what those terms mean and how they apply to the bill. And I will have to do it that way, because we don't have committee amendments which will allow for discussion, and you only get three turns to speak on the motion to advance the bill itself. When I arrived at an amendment of the kind that I'm offering now, where I'm serious, then I'll make that clear. And in order that it is in the record, after our kind of wide-ranging discussion, what this amendment does, it will simply add words to the portion of the law that relates to the kind of written notice that the dealer who delivers the vehicle must give to the person who is going to receive the delivered vehicle. And the language being added will be a mirror image of the language that we adopted previously under the operative part of the law that establishes the responsibilities assumed by a dealer who delivers one of these vehicles. Senator Kristensen made some very cogent points about why a Honda dealer in Nebraska may choose to deliver a Honda in this state which resulted from a transaction in another state. I don't know for sure, but it's possible that there might be some provision in these franchise agreements with Honda and maybe other car dealers and manufacturers that they have to do these things, provide these courtesy deliveries of their vehicle. I don't know that. There is so much that I do not know about this area of commercial activity. But as we draft a law, whether we know the ins and outs of the commercial activity, we do have to try to come to an understanding of how whatever we put into the law is going to impact on people who are engaged in this commercial activity. Some of this language I don't even know why it's really here. But as we proceed with the discussion, we can find out. And maybe in view of some of the points that Senator Beutler raised, instead of going through the green copy, starting at the first point in the green copy where there is new language, maybe the thing to do is to pick out the areas that generate the most concern and discuss them. But I'd still like to see us take it in manageable bites and pieces. My amendment, I think, can be adopted without too much...
