PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROMM: ...create the proper paper trail for the sales tax. Now if somebody is going to register their car, they're going to have to...they're going to have to deal with that sales tax. But if they don't...if they don't register it, or try to go a long time without registration, having a dealer with a form that sends a form in helps create a paper trail.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, very good. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. For discussion on the Chambers amendment, Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Lieutenant Governor. I had an opportunity, on Senator Beutler's time, to say what I was going to say, and that is that I support this amendment. Let me...let me also say that I think that there may be some questions develop at some point in time with respect to Internet sales. We are committed to looking at that section and have had some contact from one or more companies that involve themselves in Internet sales. But we have asked them to allow us to focus on the bill, as we are now, on General File, but if the bill goes to Select File, I think we'll be offering at least one amendment with respect to specifically Internet sales, and we'll have an opportunity to spend some time with that. And we may spend that time here, I don't know. I just...I just tell you that because that is what I certainly propose to do. So with that, I'll yield the rest of my time, Mr. Lieutenant Governor.
