charge the consumer. The dealer in Nebraska charges the seller. And that way the seller then can give the whole load to the buyer all at once, whatever it's going to be in its totality, and that's all the amendment does. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. For discussion on the Beutler amendment, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I'm in support of the thrust of Senator Beutler's amendment. Senator Beutler, would you just read what it says and where it goes, because I'm trying to...my bill is so marked up, I want to be sure where we're inserting new language.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, on page 15, line 25, after the period, insert the language "The motor vehicle dealer may charge the seller for such service but shall not charge the purchaser."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could you say it again? Then I'll just listen and not try to write it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: "The motor vehicle dealer may charge the seller for such service but shall not charge the purchaser."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, that's where I was getting thrown. We're saying that the dealer and the seller have to come to an agreement, and the purchaser is not involved in that back and forth between himself or herself and the one who delivers the vehicle.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Precisely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I just wanted to be sure I understood it. And when Senator Beutler explained it, it was so clear that I had to be sure that I wasn't missing something. This takes care of "Patch-Eye John." And, Senator Bromm, I found out that "Patch-Eye John" was the wrong member of the family. He called me last night and said, you're talking about "Patch-Eye Pete," that's the one who you have to watch. But with Senator Beutler's amendment, the purchaser will not have to worry about
