evil you want to prevent, unless they're going under, unless some of those other exceptions, which are acceptable or they've got some other incentive programs. But to me, I guess, I would be cautious about taking that out because I think that might be exactly one of the evils that I'd want to prevent. And I'll give you the rest of my time and I'll listen for Senator Bromm. But at the present time I probably...I'm not willing to say that I think that that's a simple change and one we ought to do. I'd probably be hesitant, I'd probably not do it at this time, unless I'm convinced otherwise. I'd yield my time to Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, none of these amendments that I'm offering...that I've offered already or may offer are so pressing that they have to be adopted right now. So, in view of the concerns expressed by Senator Kristensen and the fact that I have no hidden agenda, I am going to withdraw that amendment which is pending...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because we can discuss it further, off the floor. And I don't need to take any time now. But I kind of got the high sign from Senator Kristensen when I said that I might go ahead and introduce it so we can get something into the record. And now that we have and there are questions as to just how far this amendment would go and the impact it would have, I think those interested in the bill are alerted to the fact that there needs to be further discussion on it. I'm going to withdraw that pending amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Without objection? It is withdrawn. Debate on the advancement of LB 1018? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I believe everybody who has an interest in this bill has been acting in good faith. So if not every question is answered to my satisfaction while we're on General File, I'm not going to do anything to delay the bill. I cannot vote for it at this point. I still have concerns about the underlying philosophy and the policy, and there are some
