PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Kristensen, would you yield to a Chambers...Senator Chambers' question?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes, I would yield.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kristensen, on page 12, line 20, that notorious line on that notorious page, is the word "interest."

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It is your feeling at this point that that word need not be modified in any way. I had thought about offering an amendment to say "a legal interest." But is it your feeling that that is unnecessary?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Well, it...yes,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...plainly, yes. I...I'm...I'd be open to change, I'm not saying that. I'm just...if you asked me my plain meaning of that, that's what my plain meaning would mean, that's a legal interest other than a fanciful interest.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If the word "legal" were to be inserted, would that change the meaning that is intended?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Not to my understanding,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I don't have to do it...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...not...not to me.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...right now. We can talk about that further.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Not at first glance, no.
