SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I'm...I'm not going to do anything with it right now.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Well, comfortable is an elusive...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I'm comfortable with the intent. I don't...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Well, of the bill in general. That provision probably...I'm comfortable with what it's trying to accomplish. If you're asking me am I comfortable about the way it is worded and what its precedent might be, I'm not as comfortable with that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you, Senator Kristensen. Members of the Legislature, as I said, I'm going to take my three times to speak, to get some things into the record. I have offered several amendments already.
