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and 19, to see if I've focused properly and whether I have an understanding, the same understanding as you of this language on pages 18 and 19.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So, first of all, I think all of us need to have a common understanding of what it means and does. So I wanted to talk a little bit about 18 and 19 and the whole rationale for this particular section, which I think is the most troublesome section of the entire bill. The rest of the bill certainly is very arguable, but this section seems dubious to me. Let me explore my understanding of it. First of all, it says "no manufacturer, distributor, or other person", and let me stop right there, "or other person", does that include a franchisee?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. "No manufacturer, distributor, or other person" including a franchisee "required to have a license to sell motor vehicles in this state shall, directly or indirectly, sell motor vehicles by mail or the Internet to any consumer in this state without first complying with" all the sections of law having to do with motor vehicle licensing. First of all, it's limited to "in this state." So...well, let me go back one more step. If we're talking about a franchise...franchisee, and let's say we have one in Omaha, or better yet let's say we have one in Falls City, and the franchisee in Falls City puts on the Internet or sends a mailing to Omaha and says, folks, they sell cars for too much in Omaha, come down here to Falls City and buy a car from me. Is that franchisee prohibited from doing that by this provision?

SENATOR BROMM: No.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So they could do it, but they would have to comply with all the provisions of 60-1401 and 60-1440, right? And...

SENATOR BROMM: That...that's right.
