SENATOR BEUTLER: The net is not located anywhere.

SENATOR BROMM: Well, I...you're right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, I'm...

SENATOR BROMM: But...but I don't think that's the key. I think where the cars are being offered, where the delivery...where the car would be picked up, basically where the salesman is, I think that's the key so that you don't fall into that special permit area.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Would it require delivery to be at the established place of business, or could delivery be to another...

SENATOR BROMM: If the dealer is a resident dealer from within the state, the delivery can be...can be anywhere.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And that's an interpretation, that's the rules and regs as they're being applied currently.

SENATOR BROMM: That's what I have been told, that's what I understand.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. It's...it...this rule indicates that a manufacturer or a distributor cannot sell motor vehicles by mail or the Internet. Now, the other part of the bill basically indicates that a manufacturer or distributor can't be a franchise...cannot be a franchisee, right?

SENATOR BROMM: That's right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So, they couldn't sell cars in Nebraska, period, right?

SENATOR BROMM: Without...without...without going through the dealer, right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Could they establish a web site in Nebraska and sell cars?
